
Cuba is one of the most populous countries in the Caribbean, and one of the few Marxist-Leninist socialist states. The United States has had a trade embargo with Cuba since 1960, and travel has been restricted since approximately 1962. We will be visiting for educational purposes, which will make us eligible for travel visas.

The trip is designed to appeal to a broad range of interests, so bring your curiosity and a willingness to try new things. You can expect a full schedule of activities every day, with a mix of lectures, outdoor adventures, and cultural activities.

STEM Adventure



In considering how to build a more sustainable future, what if we glimpsed into thousands of years of history to find the solutions? There is no better place to do so than Greece, where ancient societies adapted to their environment and preserved their cultural traditions for centuries. In this Special Program,



we will travel to Athens and the island of Crete, to learn from local and international non-profits, immerse ourselves in farm life, and apply a historical lens to examining environmental sustainability.



We will fly into Athens, where we will first spend a couple of days exploring the city, sightseeing, and learning about local sustainability initiatives. We will then head to the island of Crete, where we will do a farm stay and learn about local food systems and the rich history of the island. We will also do a cooking lesson and learn

about the production process of staples of the Greek diet. Upon return to Athens, we will climb scenic Lycabyttus and conclude our trip by meeting with a few more local experts, before departing for home.

When we think of the West Coast, we think of sandy beaches and sunshine. But a magical land of fog and trees exists just to the north. This 10-day travel program will take us road-tripping throughout the beautiful Pacific Northwest AND BEYOND! Major stops along

the way include:

- Portland, Oregon, the City of Roses – home to Portlandia, hub of indie culture, music, coffee, giant bookstores, and stunning wilderness. Our daily adventures will include finding delicious food spots, learning the history of the area, taking in the sights, exploring nearby hikes and waterfalls, and visiting museums and famous landmarks.

what, you should be ready to be curious, try new foods, sleep away from home in a room with other students and in a tent, and explore what the Bay Area has to offer!






Birth & Death




Local Program Cost: \$200


Travel Planners Unite! An Exploration of the Bay Area
